History In the 1970s, Autocad and the AutoCAD drawing-table system were used to prepare industrial drawings. However, CAD software had not yet become a commercial product, so the first Autocad release, labeled as Autocad "AutoCAD, version 1.0" (v1.0), was only for private use. Version 1.5, released in 1984, was the first version of AutoCAD available for commercial use. On December 8, 1982, the first release of AutoCAD was announced as AutoCAD, version 1.5 (v1.5) for the Apple II microcomputer. In 1983, the first release of AutoCAD was published for the IBM PC. In 1987, Autocad for Windows was introduced, and in 1992, a graphic user interface (GUI) was introduced, with version 2.0 (v2.0). Between 1997 and 2001, Autocad for Windows was known as "AutoCAD LT", which is the name used in some of the user manuals, even though it is not true for the software itself. The two editors can import and export EPS files, and the export formats available for each include PDF, JPEG, PNG, TIFF, PS, and GIF. At a special city-wide session at the Library of Congress, the DC City Council will consider a proposed revision to the current DC budget. In short, the city wants to spend \$8.3 billion (20% of total DC revenues) on "the critical priorities of the District's capital plan." While the specifics of this plan are still in flux, they include a \$5.8 billion dollar budget for the DC Water and Sewer Authority, and a \$2 billion dollar plan for a new hospital, or "renovate, fix, and replace" (as DC Mayor Vincent Gray put it). While the details of the plan are unknown, the idea is to fund infrastructure that will benefit the District for many years to come. While this might sound great, the plan is vague, and by no means the only way to improve the quality of life in DC. After an unprecedented wave of local ballot initiatives in the past few years, this budget may be one of the last chances to create policies that will shape the future of our city. Thus, it is important to make your voice heard on this issue, and make sure to vote on Tuesday. Of course, the city's current operating budget is insufficient, but instead of going down the road of protecting and funding existing services, the city should be looking towards the future. The city has over 50,000 vacant and abandoned properties, which is a scourge on the city and, most importantly, an open door to crime. These properties should be turned into subsidized, affordable housing units. Yet, there is currently no plan in place to do this. Furthermore, DC has a chronic shortage of safe and affordable childcare options. Despite a recent report showing that DC has a childcare-to-employment gap of about 80%, DC has no plan to change this.
